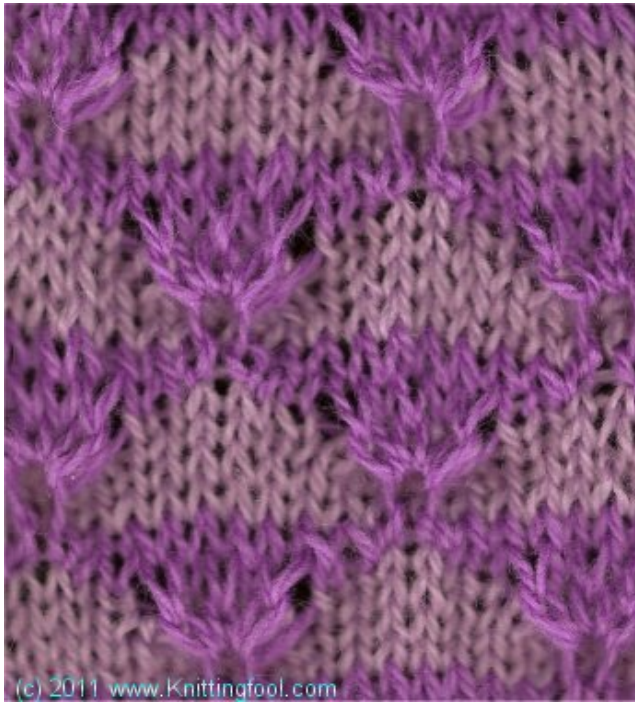


Fan Dip

Multiple of 10 stitches plus 2 stitches

Colors A and B.

Cast on with Color A and knit one row.

Row Number	Color	Begin Row	Repeat		End Row
Row: 1 - (Wrong side)	A	p8 *	k1, p9	repeat from *	ending p3
Row: 2 -	B	*	knit	repeat from *	
Row: 3 -	B	*	purl	repeat from *	
Row: 4 -	B	*	knit	repeat from *	
Row: 5 -	B	*	purl	repeat from *	
Row: 6 -	A	*	(k1, insert right hand needle from the front under the purled Color A stitch 5 rows below and draw up a loop; knit the next stitch and pass the loop over the stitch just worked) 3 times; k4	repeat from *	ending k2
Row: 7 -	A	p3 *	k1, p9	repeat from *	ending p8
Row: 8 -	B	*	knit	repeat from *	

Row: 9 -	B	*	purl	repeat from *	
Row: 10 -	B	*	knit	repeat from *	
Row: 11 -	B	*	purl	repeat from *	
Row: 12 -	A	k5 *	(k1, insert right hand needle from the front under the purled Color A stitch 5 rows below and draw up a loop; knit the next stitch and pass the loop over the stitch just worked) 3 times; k4	repeat from *	ending k1

Repeat Rows 1 - 12

Legend for Abbreviations and Notes		
Take care not to twist the loops in this pattern. It may be necessary to shuffle the loop from needle to needle to manipulate them into a position where they are not twisted. It is useful to work the loops loose so as to avoid drawing the fabric up.		

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
